All candidates managed the interview process well. They also carried out a practical demonstration of delivering milk from the college office to the Hub and we were very pleased to offer the jobs to students who were exceptional.

Interviews were also held for various other jobs around the Sheiling site including painting an office, cleaning and woodwork.
