Mencap

Students have been attending 6-week employment workshops run by Mencap. The workshops focus on a range of soft employment skills each week including communication and time-keeping.

On completion of the 6-week course participants are then offered 4-weeks of work experience. We have piloted the very first programme working with Mencap to make small adjustments to enhance and build a more inclusive and interactive experience for students.

We were privileged to be involved in the process and our students and staff have enjoyed the workshops. We are now close to finishing our second 10-week block and we hope to send more students in the next academic year.



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
